

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m., by Chairman, Richard Robinson. Also in attendance were; Member, Al Holman; Member, Richard Desjardins; and Asst. Public Health Supervisor, Diane Tiernan.

Agenda was reviewed and approved

Motion one – Richard D. made a motion to approve of the meeting minutes from 10/27/15 and 10/30/15 with corrections. Al seconded the motion and Richard R. made the motion unanimous. Minutes were approved.

Vouchers were reviewed and signed.

A food permit for C & N Food/Dunkin Donuts, Hartford Avenue was reviewed and signed.

Motion two – Al made a motion to approve of the food permit and Richard D. seconded the motion. Richard R. made the motion unanimous. Permit was approved.

Board discussed the condemned property at 92 Hopkinton Road, home of Tara Mezei. Diane stated she has heard that the tenant, Yvonne Kadlik will be requesting a 14 day extension to stay in her apartment at the house. As yet, she has not filed the request with the court system. Richard D. stated there will be a great concern with the pipes bursting if we do not shut the water off before the middle of December. He personally is against the extension for Yvonne. Al and Richard D. agreed.

Diane stated that the ACO, Mike Moran, has visited Maryann Lasalla's property at 32 Pleasant Street. It appears she has only 3 dogs in her home, and is now in compliance with our regulations.

A request from the Conservation Commission to be advised when we schedule perc and deephole testing was discussed. Board stated the Commission is welcome to check our agenda or come to our meetings, but we will not be advising them every time a field test is done.

A site plan for Kiwanis Beach upper parking lot was reviewed. The plan was submitted by the DPW. The new parking lot will have access on Cider Mill Lane and the additional parking area will allow people who have limited walking capabilities to access the field. Board agreed it was a great idea and had no comments for the Planning Board.

Diane reviewed information pertaining to the Avian flu in poultry. Diane was asked to run a news item in anticipation of the threat.

Mail was reviewed.

A letter from Senator Moore's office was reviewed, regarding the Grafton Upton Railroad and the noise complaints. Recently, the court of appeals has remanded the residents case back to the Surface Transportation Board and Senator Moore was requesting immediate action be taken upon the railyard. Board stated unless the STB makes a change with the judgement, we will not be taking any action. Al stated that the railyard is in compliance with the noise regulation anyways, and there is no longer any

pure tone. Even if the STB did change their decision, the railyard is in compliance. Board stated that we could have an open discussion with Jon Delli Priscoli, owner of the G.U.R.R. and he could inform us himself what has been completed with the sound engineers. If the public has concerns, the information is available.

Next meeting will be held on December 10th.

Motion three – Richard D. made a motion to adjourn and Al seconded the motion. Richard R. made the motion unanimous.
