News from the Town Clerk's Office



Winter has finally arrived. We hope everyone stays warm on these cold & snowy days.

- * Annual Census/Street Listing Forms (including dog license form) have been mailed to all households. Please review and return those forms as soon as possible either by mail or email (census@uptonma.gov) to the Clerk's office. A full and accurate count of all residents (including children) is important for many reasons, one of which is for allocation of State and Federal funds. Also, the Census is used to update the voting list and provide data on present and future school populations.
- * Dog licenses for calendar year 2024 are now available. Dogs three months or older need to be licensed each year by April 1. A current rabies vaccination record and spaying/neutering certificate is required prior to issuing a license. Licenses are \$10.00 for all neutered/spayed dogs and \$20.00 for male and female dogs that have not been neutered/spayed. Dog licenses may be purchased in the office (cash or check-payable to the Town of Upton), online at <https://ma-upton.civicplus.com/664/Online-Payments> or through the mail. If mailing please include the dog's name, age, breed, color, rabies certificate, spaying or neutering certificate (if applicable), telephone number, check payable to the Town of Upton and a self-addressed stamped envelope to the Town Clerks Office, 1 Main St – Suite 11, Upton MA 01568.
- * The Secretary of State's office mailed postcard applications to request Vote by Mail Ballots to all registered voters. Vote by Mail will be an option for ALL elections this year. Also, we will offer In-person Early voting at town hall for the March 5th Primary, September 3rd State Primary and the November 5th Election.
- * 2024 Election & Town Meeting schedule:
 - * Tuesday, March 5th Presidential Primary 7 am – 8 pm at Nipmuc HS;
 - * In-person Early voting at Town Hall: Saturday, February 24th 9 am – 5 pm; then during regular Town Hall hours the week of February 26th thru March 1
 - * Thursday, May 2nd Annual Town Meeting
 - * Tuesday, May 7th Annual Town Election
 - * Tuesday, September 3rd State Primary
 - * Tuesday, November 5th Presidential Election

SMOC Fuel Assistance



If you were approved for Fuel Assistance last year, you should have recently received a pre-printed re-application form directly from SMOC (South Middlesex Opportunity Council) for the upcoming heating season. To avoid delays in receiving your benefits, gather your updated documents early and review any changes that need to be made on your application. Please call the Upton Senior Center at 508-529-4558 to make an appointment for assistance or for more information.

- 1 Person: \$45,392
- 2 People: \$59,359
- 3 People: \$73,326
- 4 People: \$87,294
- 5 People: \$101,261
- 6 People: \$115,228

AARP TAX PREPARATION BY APPOINTMENTS - MONDAYS STARTING FEBRUARY 5th

This year, AARP Foundation is again providing free tax preparation and e-filing for taxpayers with low to moderate income through the AARP Foundation Tax-Aid program. AARP Tax-Aid is the nation's largest free tax assistance and preparation service. You do not need to be a member of AARP or retiree to use this free service. Taxpayers are encouraged to have the following documents when they arrive at the **Old Senior Center Building** (located at 2 Farm Street) to get their returns completed:

- Pre-Appointment Intake Forms (available at the Senior Center)
- Photo ID
- Social Security Cards for all dependents on tax return
- Birth Dates for anyone on tax return
- Voided Check from Bank if Direct Deposit
- Real Estate Tax Bills
- Water & Sewer Bills
- Health Insurance Coverage Information for Taxpayer, Spouse, and all Dependents
- Seniors with Full-Year Enrollment in Medicare Need Only to bring their SSA-1099 with them
- All other income related documents
- Last Year's Tax Return
