CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Pursuant to Governor Baker's March 12, 2020 Order Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law, G.L. c. 30A, §18, and the Governor's March 15, 2020 Order concerning imposition on strict limitations on the number of people that may gather in one place, meetings in the Town of Upton are being conducted via remote participation to the greatest extent possible. Review Annual Town Meeting Warrant

The Town Manager briefed the Board what the implications of the American Rescue Plan Funding may have on the Warrant. ARP Funding amounts to approximately 2.4 million. What is not known at this time, is how both the town and the schools can use what amounts, to almost \$3 million in federal funds. The Department of Treasury is still working on guidance, expected to be released in mid-April.

39 It suggests that this money can be used for infrastructure, but in parentheses, they put water and sewer
40 infrastructure. The first question the Town would want to know is what types of infrastructure or is it
41 just going to be focus on water and sewer. In the legislation, it talks about using percentage of these
42 dollars to replace lost revenue to municipalities. Third component was to support local businesses. The
43 Board approved the warrant last week which included a 1.4 million override requested by the school
44 district and the 12.4 community center debt exclusion. The conversation turned to how might the ARP
45 funding mitigate the school override. The issue with the election being May 11, the ballots must go to
46 print at the end of the week.

48 The Town Clerk, Kelly McElreath recommended the Selectmen either change the date of the Election to
49 May 18 at Nipmuc Regional High School or keep the original date but move the polling location to the
50 Town Hall. The Selectmen will decide at their next meeting.

52 After much discussion, the Selectmen did vote to rescind the Prop. 2 ½ override ballot question for the
53 Mendon Upton Regional School District due to the probability of the School Committee recertifying its
54 budget at a lower number.

56 **Motion #1:** Motion made by Selectman Matellian to rescind the vote regarding Question 2 on the
57 ballot, for override question in the amount of \$1,042,672 for the purpose of funding the MURSD.
