Tax Bills are getting mailed beginning of January —
Q3 due 2/2/2026, Q4 due 5/1/2026

The FY26 Tax rate is \$13.08. The application timeline for all Real
Estate and Personal Property Abatements for FY26 is January 1, 2026
to February 2, 2026 at 5PM and the Abatement applications will be
available in the Assessor's office and on the Assessor's web page.

Annual Street Listing Census will be mailed in January to all house-
holds, it is important to return your paperwork to the Town Clerk's
Office so town census can be up to date.

Dog Licenses — All dogs 3 months and older should be licensed with
the town. Licenses can be requested online, in person at the Town
Clerk's Office or by mail.
Rabies certificates are required if not already on file.

Winter Parking Ban Information

The Town of Upton's winter parking ban is in effect. The ban prohibits on street parking between the
hours of 1:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. from November 1 through April 1.

The Town of Upton prohibits parking of any vehicle on a town road from the start of a snow or ice
storm until 12 hours after the storm ends.

The Town of Upton is authorized to have any car towed that is obstructing snow removal operations.

Community Spotlight

[Alfred Consigli](#), born December 17, 1923, is a resident of Upton, and **celebrated his 102nd birthday**—a milestone in a life marked by courage, service, and patriotism. Mr. Consigli served in the United States Army during World War II as a sharpshooter in General George S. Patton's elite "Blackcat" Tank Battalion, landing on Utah Beach on D-Day, June 6, 1944, and fighting across Europe to help secure Allied victory. He enlisted at age 18 and quickly distinguished himself for his exceptional marksmanship, earning the rank of Corporal, his skill was so precise that he successfully shot down a plane during training exercises, impressing his commanding officers and earning a place in a front-line tank platoon. Mr. Consigli fought in major campaigns including the Battle of the Bulge and the crossing of the Rhine River at Remagen, often engaging enemy positions with precision fire from Platoon Tank #6. His actions helped neutralize machine gun nests and clear the way for advancing Allied forces. Mr. Consigli continues to share his story with humility, reminding us of the sacrifices made by his generation and the enduring values of service, patriotism, and brotherhood. May we never forget the sacrifice Mr. Consigli and all those who served in World War II gave, and may we always strive to uphold the values for which they fought.
